

The Funeral of Dick Collier  
Union Mission Church was Crowded with Friends and the Curious

Danville Press: The funeral services for Richard Collier, who was hanged at Urbana last Friday, were held at 10:30 a.m., in the Union Mission church on East Seminary street, and the edifice was crowded with friends and the curious minded.

The services were conducted by George W. Woolsey, taking his text from John XX chapter: "He that is without sin among you let him first cast a stone." He spoke very feelingly and eloquently on the warning given by Christ and warned his hearers to cleanse themselves of sin before they accuse others. He also urged his hearers not to cast a stone at the mother and innocent little children, who are not to blame for the elder son's sin.

Many beautiful flowers were on the casket, several pieces being given by friends of the family in this city. The congregation sang during the services, "Nearer My God to Thee," "Shall We Gather at the River," "The Haven of Rest," and "I am a Soldier of the Cross," while Miss Minnie Millner presided at the organ. Lou Holman led the singing. The interment was in Springhill cemetery.
